# United Kingdom International Facts



The United Kingdom leads all nations for the number of foreign direct investment projects in Texas, and Texas is No.1 among the states for exports to the United Kingdom.

In 2023, Texas trade with the United Kingdom totaled \$18.2 billion, making them the state's ninth largest total trade partner.

In the last decade, companies from the United Kingdom have invested \$8.6 billion in capital investment through 326 projects in Texas, creating more than 18,200 Texas jobs.

#### Statement of Mutual Cooperation Signing





Governor Greg Abbott signed a Statement of Mutual Cooperation with United Kingdom Secretary of State for Business and Trade Kemi Badenoch to deepen the strong partnership between the United Kingdom and Texas. The signing ceremony took place at 10 Downing Street, the historic residence of British prime ministers since 1735.
